## CLUE #1 (instructions from Cindy Carter)





These pieces are small.

Press to the dark.

I recommend finger pressing these small squares rather than pressing with the iron; less distortion. Plus, you can finger press while you take a break to watch the Olympics (Ha! Timing is everything!).

It is critical that your seam is 1/4".




Please sew a couple of each unit and make sure that it measures correctly before continuing.

	Comfort	Twin	Full
A. Nine (9) Patch 	(64) 3.5" squares	(80) 3.5" squares	(100) 3.5" squares
B. Four (4) Patch 	(64) 2.5" squares	(80) 2.5" squares	(100) 2.5" squares
C. Pairs 	(48) 1.5" x 2.5" rectangles	(62) 1.5" x 2.5" rectangles	(80) 1.5" x 2.5" rectangles
D. Remaining squares for use later 	(25) 1.5" squares	(32) 1.5" squares	(40) 1.5" squares

## CLUE #2 (instructions from Cindy Carter)

It is critical that your seam is 1/4".

Unit from Step C should measure 10.5" square.

	Comfort	Twin	Full
<p>A. Two (2) 5" charms <b>and</b> 1.5" x 1.5" background rectangle <i>Press to the charms.</i></p> 	(18) units	(24) units	(32) units
<p>B. Two (2) 1.5" x 5" background rectangles <b>and</b> One (1) 1.5" accent square <i>Press to the center square.</i></p> 	(9) units	(12) units	(16) units
<p>C. Two (2) Unit A <b>and</b> Two (2) Unit B <i>Press to Unit A.</i></p> 	(9) units	(12) units	(16) units
