

Squares upon Squares Block

This makes a 12 ½" unfinished block.

Color 1 - Medium (shown as rust)

One - 3 1/2" x 10 1/2" rectangle

One - 6 1/2" squares

Color 2 – Light (shown as gold) One – 3 ½" x 21" rectangle

Color 3 - Dark (shown as brown - center block)

One - 3 ½" x 10 ½" rectangle

Block seams are ¼".

In looking for a nice seasonal block the Squares upon Squares was found. This block gets away from half square triangles; however, brings piecing back into a simple design that looks complicated. Any combination of fall colors can be used for this block as long as there is a mix of a dark center, and then medium and light blocks surrounding the center. When finished this block should piece to make a nice

- 1) Cut pieces carefully to size. Refer to the Figure 2 below.
 - a. Start by marking and cutting the Color 1 and Color 3, 3-1/2" x 10-1/2" strips into three 3-1/2" squares of each.
 - b. Mark and cut the Color 2, 3-1/2" x 21" strip into six 3-1/2" squares.
 - c. You also need one 6-1/2" square of Color 1
- 2) To sew three of the corner blocks, sew pairs of colored squares right sides together as shown in *Figure 3*, using 1/4" seams. Press seams towards the darker side. Sew these units together, again using 1/4" seams. Make <u>one</u> unit with the **Color 1** and **Color 3** small squares, and <u>two</u> units using **Color 2** and **Color 3**.
- 3) Piece the block, sewing your units together as shown in *Figure 4*. Press row seams in opposing directions, so the seams lay nice and flat.
- 4) Trim to 12 1/2". Have fun making this block!!!!

Note – Be conscious of the $\frac{1}{4}$ " seams to ensure the final block will square to 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ ". If using a scant $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam, be sure to trim each piece to size before final piecing (each complete block section should be 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " square).
