	<p>Dog</p> <p>- Background – light</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - cut one (1) 4 ½” x 4 ½” square - cut four (4) 5” x 5” squares <p>- Focus – medium/dark</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - cut one (1) 4 ½” x 4 ½” square - cut four (4) 5” x 5” squares <p>- Nose/Eyes – black</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - cut three (3) circles approximately 1 ½” x 1 ½” 		<p>Cat</p> <p>Background – light</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - cut one 2” x 4 ½” rectangle - cut one 4 ½” square - cut one 2” x 2” square <p>Focus – medium/dark</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - cut one 3” x 4 ½” rectangle - cut one (1) 4 ½” “ 8 ½” rectangle - cut two (2) 2” x 2” squares <p>Border – Contrast</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - cut two (2) 8 ½” x 2 ½” rectangles - cut two (2) 12 ½” x 2 ½” rectangles
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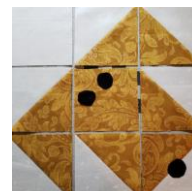
I have always had an idea of making a dog and cat combination quilt and then tying it back to the BOM program. The chase is on! Make one of EACH block. Two draw tickets will be given for the set.

Dog Directions

- 1) Using the 5” background and focus fabric squares, mark a diagonal line and sew ¼” on either side of the line. Cut on the solid diagonal line to make a total of eight (8) half square triangles (HST). Trim to 4 ½” each. Only seven (7) of the HSTs will be used.
- 2) Using the layout below, piece the background, focus, and HSTs to make a dog face. Using two (2) circles, place them in the center block for eyes, then applique. Using the remaining circle, applique it on the center of the bottom right block for the dog nose. This completes the dog block.

Cat Directions

- 3) From the 2” x 4 ½” block, add a 2” x 2” block on either side. Mark diagonally from middle to outside on each small block and then sew ON the diagonal line. Trim the outside of the block and press open. This piece makes the ears for the cat. Attach this block to the 3” x 4 ½” block (make sure to align the ‘ears’ to the ‘head’), and then attach that set to the 4 ½” square background block ensuring the background block is on the right side. Note – if the background block ends up on the left side, change to sew the small block in step 4 on the upper left side.
- 4) Using the 4 ½” x 8 ½” block, add a 2” x 2” block to the upper right corner. Mark a diagonal line from top left to bottom right of the small block and then sew on the line. Cut off extra and then press. This block becomes the body of the cat. Attach the block set from step 3 onto the block set from step 4.
- 5) Sew a 2 ½” x 8 ½” rectangle to each *side* of the cat block completed in step 4. Press out. Attach the 2 ½” x 12 ½” rectangle to the top and bottom of the block. This completes the cat block.



- 6) Trim blocks to finish at 12 ½” if needed.
