Snow Globe



Materials:

1. Globe fabric: 8- $\frac{1}{2}$ " square pre-washed Christmas fabric backed with Pellon's Wonder-Under fusible web or another paper backed fusibles. Follow the fusibles directions.
2. Globe base: black fabric backed with a paper backed fusible.
3. Background fabric: 12- $\frac{1}{2}$ " white on white square
4. Black thread

It might be helpful to cover the ironing board with an extra piece of muslin—just in case—to prevent scraps of fusible web from being accidentally ironed onto the ironing board. Use of an Applique pressing sheet will prevent fusible web from getting on your iron during pressing.

1. Place the globe 1- $\frac{1}{2}$ inch from the top of the background fabric and 1- $\frac{3}{4}$ inch from either side of the back ground fabric as shown.
2. Place the globe base 1- $\frac{1}{2}$ inch from the bottom of the background fabric and 1- $\frac{1}{2}$ inch from either side of the background fabric as shown.
3. Press fusible web.

Finishing the appliqué: Use a zigzag stitch around all unfinished edges.
