October 14, 1015 "Where Did You Get That Idea?" with Lee Anna Paylor will be our lecture.

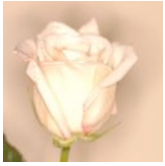
SATURDAY, October 17, 2015 - We have a workshop "Sewing with Silk" with Cheryl Lynch

Quilt Guild Speaker is Cindy Herndon.

Cindy has sewn for about 15 years. Her quilts have been accepted at various shows including Houston. She is now making art quilts and pursuing fiber arts.

Cindy talked to us about chenille. Cindy discussed the history of chenille and then showed us many of her art quilts and other crafts.

Business Meeting Started at 8:15 pm.

Acting President Debra Huebner welcomed the quilt guild.

December Minutes: No changes. Motion to accept made by Betty Tilley, Kate McMinn provided the second.

Membership Report - given by Janice. 2 guests and 32 members present tonight. Janice made up a new roster and would like members to verify.

Programs

Wednesday, 3/11/15, Joyce Hughes workshop at NE community center. Open at 9:30. Goes until 4:30.

April: Mary Kerr. Dare to dance.. Interpretation of joy of group quilting.

May: Judy Gunter: What judges look for in a quilt. She is a judge.

Community Service - Hilke Reid Hoefler discussed community service. She suggested we make a variety of bags for a service project. Bags can go to nursing homes, hospitals, etc. Suggested catheter covers / bags using sturdy fabric, beetle bags or bigger saddle bags for walkers or wheel chairs. Wants to make library bags, too. The guild voted in favor of making bags for our community service project.

Greenbelt Quilt Show at courthouse- a lot of members have quilts hanging. There is an official reception to anyone who has hung a quilt in the show or friends and family of those who have hung quilts. Need to RSVP though. Reception is on 3/26 from 5 - 6:30.

CRAZY QUILT BLOCK

12" FINISHED BLOCK

FABRICS: Anything Non-Quilt Fabric

Use any fabric type you want. The goal is to be CRAZY!!! 😊

Start with a base piece and sew on each additional piece but just covering a section of the last piece. Sew your decorative stitch over top of the seam immediately after attaching the two pieces.

Keep building your block this way. Seams do not need to be $1/4"$. It is actually easier if your seams are larger.

I used a variegated thread for my decorative stitches so it appears to change color. Use whatever you would like, as many colors as you like.

Once you have your large scrappy crazy pieces sewn together, use a one sided stabilizer to fuse to the back. I used pellon 906F. 905 or 911 would work also. Make sure to use a pressing cloth over any heat sensitive fabrics.

After you fuse it, trim the block to $12 - \frac{1}{2}"$ inches square.

Now sew a stabilizing stitch $1/8"$ from the edge around the whole block. This will secure the edges and the stabilizer.

I will upload a bigger picture to the yahoo group as well.
