President's Corner

Those of you that weren't at last month's Guild meeting missed a wonderful speaker. Shannon G. Shirley shared some of the collection of quilts that were made in response to her challenge to "Celebrate the Day" with quilts and I was inspired.

I understand that our guild has not done any kind of challenge project during the past 2 years. I do remember that Shirley Mandler did a couple of Mystery Quilts @ 2-3 years ago but I'm not aware that there's been anything since then. So, I thought it might be fun for each of us to challenge ourselves and one another and see what we come up with. This would be a golden opportunity to try out new techniques, tools, materials, trims, etc.

My proposal is that each participant select a specific date and make a quilt @ 24"X36" to honor one of the unique holidays that falls on that particular date. For example: July 25th is "Day out-of-time day", it's also "National Merry Go Round Day", "Thread the Needle Day", "Culinarians Day", "Birthday of the Birthday Cake Day", "National Hot Fudge Sunday Day", or "A Chorus Line Birthday" (1975) depending on the website you chose to visit (there are several). What date should we each choose? Why not honor our own birthday (after all, that's something we never do for ourselves) by selecting one of the 'holidays' (serious, goofy or unique) that most inspires us and falls on that specific date. The only caveat would be if 2 or more people share the same birth date, each would choose a different occasion falling on the same date.

When would we reveal our masterpieces? How about February or March, 2016, when there is little else going on OR, we could do June, 2016, at the Guild party.

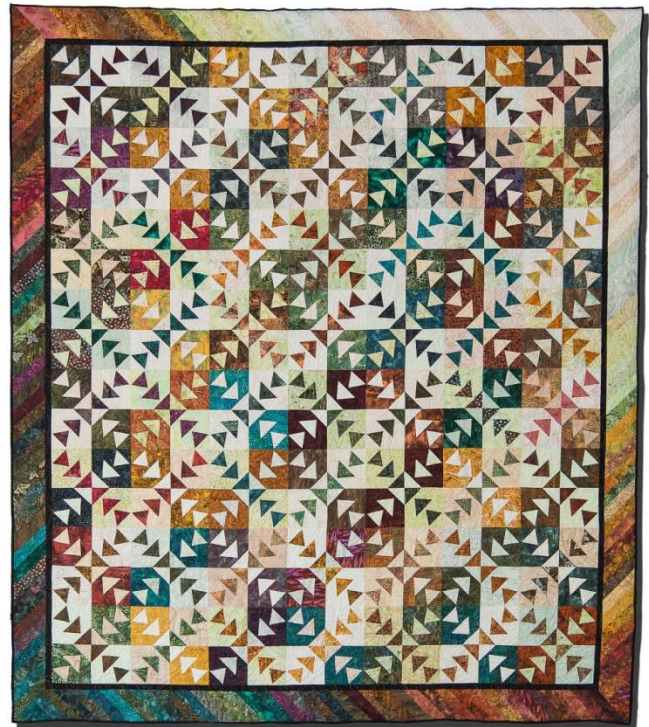
