President's Corner



I had the opportunity to attend a couple of local quilt shows in Michigan recently. Once again, I was struck by the variation of quilts and couldn't help but compare what was being shown there with what we see here. There was a very high percentage of felt and wool being used in applique work and hand embroidered scenes combined with pieced borders and sashing was also popular. I have begun to notice more wool and felt being used at the larger shows in our area but not nearly as frequently or as much. One vendor had gorgeous hand dyed fabrics and has put together a pattern specifically for making landscape quilts. One of the shows was put on by the Aitking Library Quilters in Lexington, MI. (a fairly large guild). This show was in a church. Current year's quilts were shown in a large room for all to see and vote on. Quilts that had been shown in prior years were draped over the pews, altar and anywhere else they could find in the sanctuary. It was very moving to see them all displayed this way.

Their community service projects were displayed and the pattern to make "Stockings for Soldiers" was free to any who wanted one. I had never heard of this program but really liked the concept. The organization collects handmade stockings, selects a particular soldier's name, puts that name on the cuff, fills it with things that are both special and needed and ships the stocking to be distributed to that particular soldier. It's probably a little late in the year for us as a group to participate in this project, but it's not too late if any of us is interested in getting involved at the individual level. If you want to know more, check out www.stockingsforsoldiers.org. There is a lot of information on this website including the

stocking pattern and other items they are looking for. The letters from the soldiers are particularly poignant.

You never know what inspiration you will find when you attend quilt shows both large and small.

Upcoming Programs:

There is still time to sign up for Stevii Grave's "String Quilt Workshop", Wednesday Nov 11th from 9:30am - 4:30 pm at St. Paul's Church.

In this class we will be making a stash busting string quilt that will form four pointed stars in the center of the blocks. The blocks will be made on a foundation that will control the shape. This is an easy, no stress process. The quilt, which finishes at 60" x 72" can be made either scrappy or with any other colors of your choice. For instance, Julie Trollinger is planning on black, white, and red.



Stevii Grave's String Quilt Workshop

Supplies:

- $\frac{3}{4}$ yards background fabric. Sample used white, but any "reads as solid" color fabric can be used
- Scrap fabric "strings" at least 6" long, width varying from 1"-2 1/2" wide. Bring as many as can be crammed into a gallon zip lock bag.
- Neutral sewing thread
- Sewing machine and standard fare (needle, cords, foot pedal, seam ripper, extension cord, surge protector, pincushion, etc.)
- Thread snips
- Small scissors
- Rotary cutter, 12.5" square ruler, cutting mat at least 14" square
- Iron / ironing pad (If you don't have one, we are known to be good sharers)
- Kit fee: \$10 will include foundation and template for center kite shape.

Please be thinking of ideas for the charity that we will support at Christmas.

Ideas need to be presented at the November meeting so that we can bring in requested items at our Christmas social on December 9. Also, if you have any party ideas for the Christmas social, please let Pat or Julie know.

NOVEMBER 2015 BOM

BLACK TIE AFFAIR

TWO 8-1/2" BLOCKS

Fabric: Black and a Bright Fabric

Cutting:

Black Fabric: Cut four 4-1/2" squares, cut two 2" squares

Color Fabric: Cut four 4-1/2" squares, cut two 2" squares

Sewing:

Place the 2" squares over the corner of 4 opposite fabrics. Sew from point to point on the small square. Press the square open and cut away any excess on the back.



Align squares in a four patch and sew together, pressing seams open.
